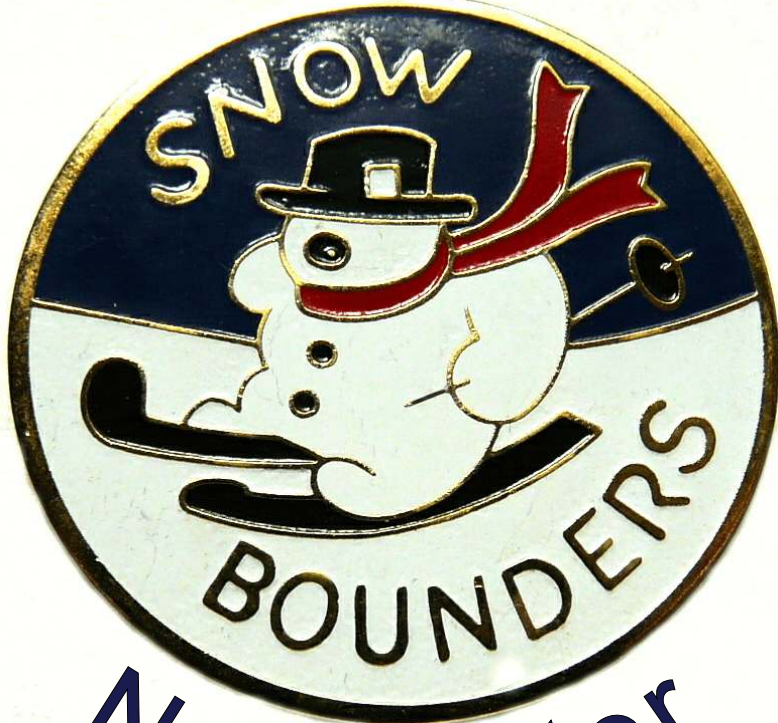

HIKE: at Mt. Baldy. Coordinated by Loren DuPuy. We can meet at my house in Fullerton (9AM) and carpool up to the Mt Baldy Ski Lift parking area. We can ride the ski lift up to Mt Baldy Notch. The round trip price is \$15.00. From the notch we can walk the road up towards Thunder Peak or take a shorter 0.6 mile walk to the overlook view of Lytle Creek and the Antelope Valley. (1.2 mi. round trip) The walk from the top of the notch to Thunder peak is 1.4 miles and an 800ft elevation gain. (2.8 mi round trip) We could have lunch at The Top of The Notch Restaurant. 2019 SKI TRIPS

MAMMOTH: SUNDAY, JANUARY 6, 2019 to FRIDAY, JANUARY 11, 2019. The January Mammoth trip coordinator is Loren DuPuy. We will be staying at the Shilo Inn Suites, 2963 Main Street, Mammoth Lakes. This is a short walk to the corner of Main Street and Old Mammoth Road. Room costs per person for five nights, two beds to a room: \$372.50 plus taxes. Room costs per person for five nights, single king size bed: \$322.50 plus taxes. And... the facility has a parking garage. The room costs are based on two people per room. It is \$129 per night for a room with a single bed (King), and \$149 per night for a room with two beds.
